This memorandum authorizes the posting of EPA-HQ-OW-2018-0270 to regulations.gov for public access.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is requesting comment to be submitted to the docket on perand polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS). PFAS is a category of man-made chemicals that have been widely used to make products because of their stain-resistant, waterproof and/or nonstick properties. The EPA will consider all comments with the purpose of:

- Obtaining information on ongoing efforts to characterize risks from PFAS and develop monitoring and treatment/cleanup techniques;
- Informing specific near-term actions, beyond those already underway, that are needed to address challenges currently facing states and local communities; and
- Developing risk communication strategies to address public concerns with PFAS.

This document will be open for public comment from May 21, 2018 to July 20, 2018.
